

Ordinance #8, Series 1992

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PARKING OR STORING OF MOTOR VEHICLES, BOATS, CAMPERS, RECREATIONAL VEHICLES AND TRAILERS IN THE CITY OF LINCOLNSHIRE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF LINCOLNSHIRE

Section 1. No person shall park, stop, or leave standing, any motor vehicle, boat, camper, recreational vehicle, or trailer, (sometimes hereinafter referred to as "vehicle" except when necessary to avoid conflict with traffic or in compliance with directions of a police officer or traffic control device;

- a. In any intersection or within 30 feet thereof;
- b. Within 30 feet of a traffic signal or sign on the approaching side;
- c. At any place where the standing of a vehicle will reduce the usable width of the roadway for moving traffic to less than sixteen (16) feet;
- d. At any place where the vehicle would block the use of a driveway;
- e. On or across any sidewalk or upon the unpaved portion of any public right-of-way within the city;
- f. At any place where official signs prohibit parking

Section 2. No vehicle shall be parked with its left side next to the edge of the roadway, except on one-way streets.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on any private property without the consent of the owner or occupant of the property; or upon any unpaved area of private property; or for the purpose of displaying the vehicle for sale. (Parking on grass is not permitted).

Section 4. No person shall park a vehicle upon any street for the purpose of:

- a. Displaying such a vehicle for sale;
- b. Washing, greasing, painting, or repairing such vehicle, except repairs necessitated by an emergency.

Section 5. No person shall park any vehicle on any street for a period of time longer than 30 minutes between the hours of 2:00 AM & 5:00 AM of any day.

Section 6. The fact that any vehicle which is illegally parked is registered in the name of a person, firm, or corporation shall be considered prima facie proof that such person was in control of the automobile at the time of such parking.

Section 7. No vehicle shall be parked within 10 feet of any fire hydrant.

Section 8. Boats, recreational vehicles, campers, or trailers shall not be parked at any time on any street within the city, except when such boat or trailer is attached to a motor vehicle for the purpose of towing such boat or trailer.

Section 9. No boat, recreational vehicle, camper, or trailer shall be parked for any period in excess of twenty-four (24) hours nearer to the street than the front wall of the residence on the lot where parked.

Section 10. Parking of boats, campers, or trailers, where otherwise permitted by the applicable Zoning District Regulations and this ordinance, shall be parked or stored in an area screened from public view and on a hard and durable surface.

Section 11. The restrictions contained herein shall not apply to emergency or police vehicles when in use on official business or pursuant to KRS 189.940.

Section 12. Any person, firm, or corporation violating the terms of this Ordinance shall upon conviction, be fined not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$500.00 for each offense and each collection container so collected in viola-

tion of this ordinance shall be deemed a separate offense, and each day on which an offense occurs shall be deemed a separate and distinct offense for which a separate fine may be levied.

Section 13. Any violation of this ordinance shall subject the offender to a civil penalty, in an amount equal to the minimum fine prescribed by Section 12 of this ordinance. Such civil penalty may be recovered by the city in a civil action in the nature of a debt if the offender does not pay the penalty within twenty (20) days after the offender has been cited for the ordinance violation. The civil penalty may be used as an alternative to or in conjunction with the criminal penalties authorized in Section 12 of this ordinance.

Section 14. This ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption and publication as required by law.
